GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

All tournament play is governed by the latest edition of The Official Rules of CueSports International (CSI) and the following regulations. For the complete CSI rules, please visit https://tinyurl.com/csibcapl. Any modifications are included in the Tournament Regulations and will take precedence over the CSI Rules and Regulations. Full Tournament Regulations can be found at: https://tinyurl.com/wsparegs.

Wisconsin or out-of-state residents must have played a minimum of four matches in a WSPA sanctioned league to play in the WSPA Team State Championships. If you have a question regarding your sanction status or eligibility, contact your League Operator or email into@wspapool.com. There is no Player Membership option to bypass league play for the Team Championships.

REFUND AND DIVISION CHANGE POLICY

Requests for refunds or division changes will only be accepted by email at info@wspapool.com. Requests must be received by the WSPA no later the latest entry deadline. Refund checks will be mailed after the tournament is complete. All refunds will be charged a \$10 fee per event.

Any player having won \$600 or more from all combined WSPA tournaments will be required to fill out Form W-9 which will be available at the tournament(s). If you do not fill out this form, we will be required to withhold 30% of your prize money. The WSPA will report your winnings to the IRS and send you Form 1099-MISC.

Players and spectators are expected to conduct themselves in a respectable manner. Any negative actions of players or spectators that reflect negatively on the organization or venue will not be tolerated and will result in probation or suspension from WSPA events

SOFT/SAFETY BREAKS

- No intentionally soft breaks or safety breaks.
- 2. If your break is illegal, with or without a foul, your inning ends. Your opponent may:
 - A. Re-rack the balls and break.
 - B. Require you to re-rack the balls and break again
- 3. The game cannot continue until there is a legal break. If a break is illegal and there is also a foul, the illegal break takes precedence and the incoming player must choose either option "A" or "B" above
- 4. If it is found that you are intentionally doctoring the rack or not striking the rack with a reasonable force, that game will be forfeited. Final decisions on this violation are at the discretion of the Tournament Director.

SLOW PLAY

This rule is to minimize slow play to move events along at the scheduled pace and to offer good experience for all players. If you are on a team that has a slow player, please make sure they are playing at a reasonable pace.

- · Players can be put on a shot clock if it is determined they are taking an excessive amount of time to shoot. Event officials require that matches proceed at a steady pace. You may call a referee if you believe your opponent is consistently taking longer than one minute per shot. If after a reasonable time of observation, the referee determines that slow play is occurring, they will warn the offending player. If slow play persists after the first warning, the Tournament Director or designee will place the offending player on a shot clock. The shot clock will be used until the offending player demonstrates they can play in the allotted amount of time.

 If it is determined he or she is slow playing again in the same or a later match, the player will be warned again and watched by a tournament official. If the opponent continues to consistently take longer than a minute to shoot,
- then the penalty will be a game forfeiture.
- Slow playing a third time in an event, he or she will once again be warned, and if found to still be slow playing will forfeit their remaining games in that match.
- · A fourth occurrence by the same player will result in a warning, and if found to be slow playing again, he or she will be disqualified for the remainder of the event.

Referees will not be policing dress code violations. It is the responsibility of each team to either accept or question their opponent's attire before the break of a player's first game during team play. Final decisions on dress code violations are at the discretion of the Tournament Director and/or WSPA Board.

- Matching team shirts are required for all teams during Team competition. T-Shirts are allowed.
 Color, style (including sleeve length and neckline) of team shirts must be matching (except for players' names) for all team members. This includes front and back of shirts, if they have a logo or monogram.
- Each member of a team must have their own team shirt. Borrowing the shirt of a teammate is not permitted.

PROHIBITED CLOTHING AND ACCESSORIES

- No headphones, earbuds, AirPods, or any accessories whether or not they are connected to electronic devices
- · All clothing worn must be neat, clean, and not be in poor taste, offensive, dirty, or worn in a matter other than intended.
- Shirts: Clean neat T-shirts, collared shirts, sweaters and sweatshirts are permitted. Sweatshirts with hoods must have the hood down; they cannot be worn up over the head.
 Shorts and pants must be conservative with respect to the rise in relation to the length of the garment, and may not be excessively baggy, loose fitting, or worn with the waistline below the top of the hips.
- Sleeveless shirts worn over undergarments are prohibited.
- Shoes: Men and women must wear clean and clean shoes at all times. Open-toed sandals can be worn, but no flip-flops of any kind
- · Headgear permitted: Billed or brimmed hats or caps that are clean, neat and worn with the bill straight forward. Cowboy hats are also acceptable.

ENFORCEMENT PROCEDURES

- The following dress code violations may be required to be corrected immediately at any time the dress code is in effect:
 A. Improper headgear may be required to be corrected or removed.

 - B. Button down shirts may be required to be adjusted to meet the dress code.
 - C. Any dress code violation by a player practicing in the tournament area when not involved in a match
 - D. Untied shoes may be required to be corrected.
 - For violations of (C), players will be asked to immediately stop practicing and leave the player's area if the violation cannot be corrected immediately.
- 2. If they cannot be corrected immediately, all other dress code violations will be enforced upon being discovered by any referee or tournament official at any time during a match. Penalties and procedures are described below.

- 1. First violation: the player's current game is lost. Any other team game(s) in progress will not be affected and will continue, regardless of the status or progress of the game(s). 2. Second violation in any later match in any event: disqualification from the event and all remaining events.

MEDICAL EXCEPTIONS

layers needing an exception to these rules for medical reasons must provide a letter on official letterhead from the player's health care provider before the tournament begins and present that to the Tournament Director.
